History Corner Returns

Magna Carta -800th Anniversary: June 5th 1215 AD



The Magna Carta, a document 3500 word document is a foundation stone of liberal democracies around the world was signed at Runnymede reluctantly by King John on June $5^{\rm th}$ 1215 AD

Within 6 months of signing the 1215 document had been repealed and another 5 versions were written in 1216, 1217, 1225 and finally in 1297

Widely viewed as one of the most important legal documents in the development of modern democracy, the Magna Carta was a crucial turning point in the struggle to establish freedom

The Magna Carta was a pact between the Lords (Barons, Earls etc) and the King which essentially limited the power of the King in relation to the power of the Lords, and established the rights of the Lords to a say in governance.

This effectively made permanent the concept of Parliament and representation in governance. However, the Magna Carta DID NOT extend these rights to the peasant class. It simply clarified the hierarchy of power within the aristocracy.

It is important in that it was the first official codicil limiting the power of a monarch and establishing a right of representation in government. This concept became fundamental to the English perspective of power and eventually spread to the formation of a house of commons, and, in the American revolution, to a representative form of government that eschewed aristocracy entirely.

As such it was an important step on the cultural evolution of modern republican governance.

Ron Clark – an Australian icon passes away June 17 2015

There is proabably not one of us who does not forget being glued to the radio or watch that 17inch television to listen to our most famous long distance runner, Ron Clark win all those long distant races and break world record after world record. Also we can never forget from all those years past, the huge dissapoinment at the Olympic Games that Ron ran and the expectations of a nation.- never to win a gold medal

Ironically, it was the 1968 Mexico Olympics, where Ron Clark suffered damage to his heart due to the effect of running the 10,000 metres at a high altitude. This led to his early passing

It is worthwhile considering Ron Clark's formidable achievements

- Broke 19 official world records over distances from 2 miles (3.2 km) to 20km
- Competed in 2 Olympics Tokyo 1964 and Mexico 1968 winning bronze in Tokyo for the 10,000 m- also finished 5th in the 5000m and 6th in the 10,000m in Mexico City

• Won 3 Commonwealth Games silver medals in 1962 (Perth) and in 1966(Kingston Jamaica)

Ron Clark also played for the VFL in Essendon Reserves and was one of the original inductees in the Sport Australia Hall of Fame in 1985

The other famous long distance runner, John Landy said of Ron Clark

"He set a standard for athletes around the world- He was a wonderful athlete and a wonderful person"

An enduring legacy was Ron Clark's success in nominating and winning the Gold Coast's right to host the 2018 Commonwealth Games

200th Anniversary of the Battle of Waterloo _ June 18th 1815



As Sydney's oldest existing pub, The Hero of Waterloo boasts *a secret tunnel* which, although now sealed, once provided an underground link to a nearby wharf. It had two uses. One as an inbound supply route for smuggled rum and secondly as an exit route for pressganged new recruits for undermanned clippers waiting on the harbour.

Men drinking in the bar would be slipped a Mickey Finn, a drink laced with spirits, to get them quickly intoxicated. They would be taken through the tunnel at night and the following morning, presumably a rude awakening, find themselves shackled on board a ship preparing to raise anchor.
